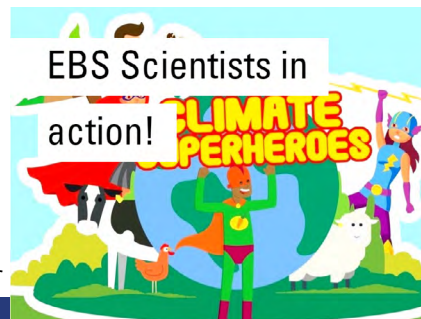
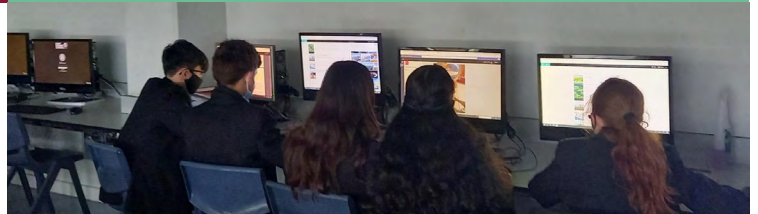

STEM COMPETITION FOR YEAR 8

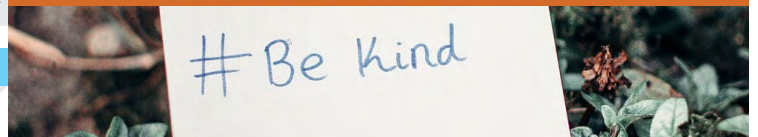

DIVERSITY FOCUS ON... ENGLISH!

Alice Walker was born in 1944 and was raised in Eatonton, a small farming town in the state of Georgia. She endured several hardships as a child, including losing the sight in one eye in an accident when she was 8 years old. She was shot with a BB gun and because the family did not have access to a car, she was delayed in getting medical attention and eventually went blind in one eye. This experience gave her time to develop a passion for reading stories and eventually she went on to produce one of the most successful novels in recent history, 'A Colour Purple.' The film adaptation went on to become a huge success and made over \$140 million. She has won many international awards and most famously The Pulitzer Prize in 1984. She is an avid campaigner for Human Rights and Equality and holds onto the belief that we all have the power to make a positive change:
