POTIONS CLASS (MUGGLES WELCOME)


In preparation for Halloween, students collected cauldrons, ingredients and magical textbooks before heading to the first EBS Potions Class! Yet to be added to the National Curriculum, our Potion Masters (Science Teachers) showed students just how cool Science can be by introducing them to changes in chemical reactions; forming bubbles, colour changes, precipitates appearing and reactants disappearing. The chemical names for the reagents were swapped to potion names and students mixed their 'ingredients' together to find out whether a chemical reaction took place.
