


WHAT WILL OUR STUDENTS ACHIEVE

Last week in assembly, we spoke to the students about the success of the England Women's Football Team and in particular their manager, Sarina Weigman, who was central to their achievements. It was wonderful to link the teams' success to that of our students and in particular there were some parallels that were drawn: 1. Always remain cool, calm and collected. Weigman ensured that the players focused on each game and each moment rather than thinking of the final. We can all be guilty of this, and students especially - worrying about their future or exams; whilst having goals is incredibly important but taking each day and each lesson at a time helps us to reduce anxiety and remain 'cool, calm and collected'. I asked the students 'what small things can you do to make each moment better?' Be on time, have all the right equipment, be attentive in lessons. If we focus on the small things, the big things take care of themselves - essentially this is our motto of "Do the right thing". 2. Build confidence. Weigman ensured that her team, despite their youth, were confident, through her motto 'practice makes permanent'. We are confident when we feel competent, and success comes from practice. Our motto "I want to learn" is grounded in exactly this - motivation, hard work and growth mindset - practicing again and again until we feel confident. Finally, Weigman and her team wanted to change society. This is something I know our young people will do - the students at EBS are the type to change the world and make it a better place and I can't wait to see what they achieve.

I was delighted to see so many girls at football training this week, the girls' team matches will commence very soon. A particular highlight was seeing two girls play in the first Year 7 fixture which traditionally would be made up of all boys. Their skill meant they simply couldn't be left out of the team; their contribution along with the amazing play from the other players helped us to win 9 - 0! What a start to the season! This week, the country, and the world, said a sad farewell to Her Majesty The Queen. Queen Elizabeth II was the longest reigning British monarch, and her funeral was a true reflection of her impact over the last 70 years. YEAR 11 BOYS' FOOTBALL


