Problems can only be solved if we take ownership of them. Those who blame others will always have problems."

PERMISSION FOR LOCAL SPORTING FIXTURES

Throughout their time at EBS we hope that your child will be involved in extra-curricular sporting fixtures or events. Often this involves a PE teacher taking your child to another school or sporting facility after school, in the school minibus, and dropping them back to school at the end of the event. Occasionally these events take place during the school day. If your child is selected for an event, they will be provided with all the relevant information. As Parent and Carers, you will also receive a communication with details of the event, the venue, the timings and any other relevant information. Your child will then inform their PE teacher (either verbally or via a teamsheet) whether or not they can participate having consulted you at home. As a PE Department we would like to gain your permission to take your child(ren) off-site to fixtures when selected, having confirmed attendance with their teacher. This permission will be valid for all fixtures and sporting events your child is selected for.

Texts will only be used to inform you if your child is absent from school and you have not notified us of the absence, and urgent messages, such as school closures.
