#### **WORLD BOOK DAY COMPETITION RESULTS ARE IN!**





The My Say Matters strategy has been created to ensure that young people are considered in the decision-making at Barnet Council. Whilst those who work at the council are diverse; different ages, genders, races, and more, young people are not fully represented. People under the age of 18 have such a small say in politics, so it is important that the council ensure they remember the effects their decisions make on young people. Hence the My Say Matters strategy lays down three priorities - to listen to young people, work with young people, and finally, act on what young people have shared. It offers guidance on how this can happen supported by the 'Lundy Model'. Full information about the strategy, including the strategy itself, can be found <a href="here">here</a>. Overall, those of us involved with My Say Matters have achieved the knowledge to improve how young people in Barnet express our views. We didn't do it for just ourselves, but for everyone. As written in our acceptance speech:

"Those of us involved with My Say Matters did it because we believed it was the right thing to do. There is no doubt about the fact that young people have a much lesser say in the democratic process than our adult counterparts, yet our views are just as important. Decisions that often affect us the most, with our long futures still ahead of us. Young people are not able to vote, not able to stand for election, and we often find our views are not respected too. We set out to change that. We were given the opportunity to use our voices to share how we would like to be listened to, how to show that we are being listened to, and the result of that is the My Say Matters Strategy. One that sets out best practise for giving young people their right to a say. One produced by young people, for young people. It is the young people currently stood before you that took that opportunity with bright ideas, confidence, and commitment."



Our biggest achievement has been successfully producing and marketing a strategy that has changed this. Those of us involved with My Say Matters were lucky enough to be nominated for a 'Barnet Young Citizens of the Year' Award and to attend the ceremony, including two students from East Barnet School, Samuel Board and Trystan Hueber. We were selected for a certificate of recognition for our work towards the young community in Barnet. This award was presented by The Worshipful The Mayor of the London Borough of Barnet. It has been a privilege for me to be able to be involved in such a strategy, and to then be given a civic award for it, and it has meant so much to see the impact the strategy is already making to young people across Barnet.

## SOCIAL MEDIA UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOUR

This week, we have been informed of several incidents of unacceptable behaviour on social media that is occurring outside of school hours. These sorts of incidents will not be accepted at East Barnet School.

In order to protect our students and to stop this sort of behaviour, we will need the support of all parents and carers. We give our children mobile phones for safety and entertainment, sometimes without realising the dangers we are putting them in.

Firstly, the majority of social media sites have an age restriction of 13+, that means no Year 7 should be using social media as it is illegal. Whatsapp age restriction is 16. To help you with these restrictions, we have put a list of all the social media sites and their age ratings on our Safeguarding page which can be accessed via the button to the right.

Secondly, hate speech, racism, discrimination, etc are not tolerated in law. If this has happened to your child, this must be reported to the Police. The Police will be able find out who has posted messages and deal with them appropriately. These reports can be made online.

The school will always be here to support you, and we would be appreciative to receive your support in this matter in return.
